The overall aim and specific objectives of the project:

The Training for Youth Organisations is a project based learning course where youth workers from different countries and organisations collaborate to develop, draft and implement Transnational Exchange Projects (TEPs).

Main contents and activities of the project:

Over 6 weeks, trainees engaged in activities that characterise this type of project, such as asynchronous discussions, activities and synchronous facilitated dialogue sessions. The main project activity was to create a Transnational Exchange Project ready for implementation.
